WHO WE ARE

At More Than a Phone, we believe survivors of domestic violence deserve a reliable and safe smartphone.





OUR ROOTS

This program was founded by TCC employees and is supported by many friends, including Ingram Micro, Superior Communications, Cellhelmet, and the TCC Customer Care Center.





HOW IT WORKS

We partner with wireless retailers and other businesses to gather donated phones, which are recycled and turned into monetary support.

Every participating nonprofit receives 40 smartphones, each with a sim card to activate at the time the survivor needs it. Activation is simple and is usually done within the day.

We continue looking to create new relationships that provide ways to grow our outreach and help even more communities. We are lucky to have the overhead and volunteerism for our program provided by Round Room.

We connect with communities by fostering relationships with local nonprofits.

Once activated, the survivor receives four months of unlimited talk and text, plus 5GB of data per month. We brought More Than a Phone to 61 partners in 19 states plus Washington D.C. in 2021.

Cleveland Clinic Police Department

We are thrilled to welcome The Cleveland Clinic Police Department Victim Assistance program to More Than a Phone and hope that this partnership will continue to grow and impact both organizations for years to come.

In August of 2021, The Cleveland Clinic Police Department Victim Assistance program reached out to More Than a Phone to inquire about our services. This program is incredibly unique because the police department is located directly inside the world-renowned Cleveland Clinic Hospital. We always accept used phone donations in any condition. Donated phones are recycled and turned into a monetary donation. We partner with TCC, Verizon authorized retailer, and accept donations at all their stores nationwide.

Make a Monetary Donation

We accept both one-time and recurring donations to support More Than a Phone.

- \$5/month for a year, or a one-time donation of \$60, will support a survivor by providing one month of data service, including internet, talk, and text.
- \$10/month for a year, or a one-time donation of \$120, will support a survivor by providing two months of data service, including internet, talk, and text.
- \$20/month for a year, or a one-time donation of \$240, will support a survivor by providing four months of data service, including internet, talk, and text.

Phones, chargers, and device activations are provided by corporate partners.
